Coming Soon to a Park Near You: Foundation-Funded Improvements Approved

The La Porte City Park Foundation has approved funding for several upcoming projects that will enhance the safety, accessibility and enjoyment of our parks. While these improvements are not yet implemented, plans are moving forward and the Foundation is proud to support each of them.

One of the approved items is the replacement of the battery and pads for the automated external defibrillators (AEDs) used in park facilities. This ensures that the lifesaving equipment remains in good working order and ready for use in case of emergency.

The Foundation has also approved the replacement of vandalized tennis nets on public courts to improve playing conditions and maintain the quality of our recreational spaces.

At Larson-Danielson Park, shelters will be constructed over the dugout benches. These structures will offer players and coaches protection from the elements and contribute to a more comfortable experience during games.

Stone Lake Beach received a much-welcomed sand replenishment to restore and refresh the shoreline for beachgoers this summer. This improvement enhancement both the appearance and usability of the beach area. Support has also been approved for the Summer Nature Camp. By underwriting the program, the Foundation is helping make outdoor education more accessible for local children, encouraging exploration and environmental stewardship.

Finally, the kayak storage unit near Pine Lake will receive a new wrap to enhance its visual appeal and better integrate it with the surrounding park landscape.

Each of these projects reflects the La Porte City Park Foundation's mission to promote, improve, and support La Porte's parks. As these enhancements are implemented in the coming months, they will contribute to a more vibrant, welcoming park system for the entire community.

From 14 to 80: La Porte's First Earth Day 5K Proves Parks Are for Every Generation

On a crisp Saturday morning, the kind that promises spring but still carries a whisper of winter, La Porte lined up together — side by side — at Fox Memorial Park.

There were parents holding toddlers. Teenagers adjusting earbuds. Retirees stretching cautious knees. And somewhere among them, a boy not old enough to drive and a man old enough to have grandchildren were about to chase the same goal: a finish line.

When the starting horn sounded, it wasn't just the race that began. It was a story in motion. Talon Samford, 14, charged ahead with a jawdropping time of 19:08.1, earning first place overall. Almost two hours later, David Ralston, an 80-year-old Marine veteran, walker in hand, crossed the line to roaring cheers at 1:47:13.4.

In between came 184 others — every age, every stride, every reason for showing up. They ran for health. For joy. For each other. And they ran for the parks that made it all possible.

The inaugural Earth Day 5K raised over \$6,000 for the La Porte City Park Foundation, whose mission is simple but powerful: to make sure everyone, of every age, has a place to belong. To provide great parks for every generation.

"Every step out there today happened because of a park," said Emily Archambault, Foundation Liaison. "Without these spaces — without these places — where would all these stories happen?"

It wasn't just the runners who told the story. There were toddlers bouncing in free inflatables. Locals unrolling yoga mats with Theresa from Living Tree Yoga. Musicians from Blue Sky Music tuning up. Friends sharing plates from Downs Family Catering under a blue April sky.

Each participant carried home a handmade wooden medal — a small, sustainable reminder that we are all part of something bigger, and that Earth Day is not a moment, but a movement.

There was no professional photographer there to snap a picture when David Ralston finished his final steps. But you didn't need one. The crowd's roar said everything. It said: you belong here. It said: this matters. It said: this is La Porte.

And that, perhaps more than any medal or official time, was the true finish line.

The La Porte City Park Foundation has been investing in those finish lines — in every joyful gathering, in every Saturday morning moment, in every park — for decades. And on April 26, the community ran not just for themselves, but for the future of the parks that hold their best memories, their milestones, and each other.

Because here, in La Porte, no one runs alone.
